### What's New in Cumberland County?

#### **Rowan Nursing Expansion**

The Authority has completed an expansion for RCSJ Health Professions. The expansion includes new classrooms/labs, each about 1,000 square feet. Three rooms are dedicated to nursing, and one to Career and Technical Education programs. Expansion also consists of two large storage closets for equipment, electric hospital beds, curtains for privacy, and tables and chairs to accommodate group learning. Classroom technology includes an interactive whiteboard projection system, interactive pen display monitor, Al classroom camera with pan, tilt, zoom, and instructor/presenter motion tracking capabilities, and ability for web conferencing and remote learning. Advanced simulated labs integrate with simulation and capture technology.



#### Rowan Allied Health Center

The contracts have been awarded and construction is to begin for the RCSJ Allied Health Center Building. This will create Rowan University presence on the RCSJ Campus. The building will house Rowan Medicine Clinics, in fields such as Pain Management: Neuro-Musculoskeletal Institute, Pediatrics: Rowan Integrated Special Needs, Family Practice, and Behavioral Science. The facility will also house CARES: Child Abuse Research Education & Service.



#### **Broadband Connectivity**

The NJ Bureau of Public Utilities in accordance with NJ Broadband Access Study Commission has engaged ECC Technologies, Inc. to complete a comprehensive broadband focused project in NJ. This will involve mapping, documentation, analysis, and will provide address level data on broadband infrastructure, services, competition, availability, and adoption statewide. ECC is conducting a physical inventory of existing outside plant broadband infrastructure, and will compile analyzed data into statewide and regional reports. By project end in mid-2023, an interactive website for addressed based provider coverage will be completed, with resolutions to adoption and service issues.

## What's New at the Solid Waste Complex?

#### Household Hazardous Waste Day

On Saturday, September 17, The Authority hosted its final Household Hazardous Waste and Document Shredding Day of 2022. 585 Cumberland County residents attended the September event, with participating attendees from all fourteen Cumberland County municipalities. As a result of the September 17 event, 9.688 tons (19,376 pounds) of hazardous waste were properly disposed. In addition, 731 gallons of used oil were collected, and 7.75 tons (15, 500 pounds) of paper were shredded and recycled during the September event. A total of 3.867 tons (7,734 pounds) of electronic waste were collected, sorted, stacked, and shipped out for recycling. The Authority's 2022 Household Hazardous Waste and Document Shredding events serviced 1,881 residents, resulting in the proper disposal of 24.511 tons (49,022 pounds) of hazardous waste, 2,529 gallons of used oil, 17.699 tons (35,398 pounds) of electronic waste, and the shredding and recycling of 19.37 tons (38,740 pounds) of personal documents. The 2023 Household Hazardous Waste and Document Shredding events will take place on Saturday, April 15, June 10, and September 16 from 8:00am until 2:00pm at the Solid Waste Complex.



## Environmental Education Day at the Bridgeton Public Library

On Tuesday. October 25 The Authority attended and sponsored the First Annual Environmental Education Day at the Bridgeton Public Library. Forty-four students from the Bridgeton School's Gifted & Talented program, ranging from third through fifth grade, were invited to attend a field trip to the Bridgeton Public Library. There environmental groups, including The Authority, ACUA, Citizens United of the Maurice River, Pinelands Preservation Alliance, American Littoral Society, and Belleplain State Forest taught the students about their respective organizations and the benefits they bring to Cumberland County. Students also enjoyed creating their own environmental crafts, including reusable bag designing, in an effort to choose to reuse!
